

Chosen by employer

Open enrollment every two years

Paid by the BWC—a "case rate" for every active claim regardless of claim complexity

Manages the medical aspects of a claim

Obtains medical records

Authorizes treatment requests

Communications with the claimant



Provides workers' comp coverage for private and public employers of Ohio employees

Calculates and collects premiums

Pays medial expenses to providers and compensation to claimants

Makes initial determination of claim allowance

Works with MCO to facilitate getting claimant back to work



Hearing officers hear disputed issues and issue orders

District Hearing Officer—first hearing level

Staff Hearing Officer—second hearing level

Industrial Commission—third level hearing, rarely granted

Appeal from this level to Court of Common Pleas or Court of Appeals

Employers should hire an attorney who is NOT employed by their TPA

Attorneys who are employed by TPAs cannot act as attorneys in hearings

TPAs (including their staff attorneys) cannot:

Interpret or paraphrase medical evidence

Interpret or cite case law

Cross-examine or question witnesses

File appeals without the explicit permission of the employer
